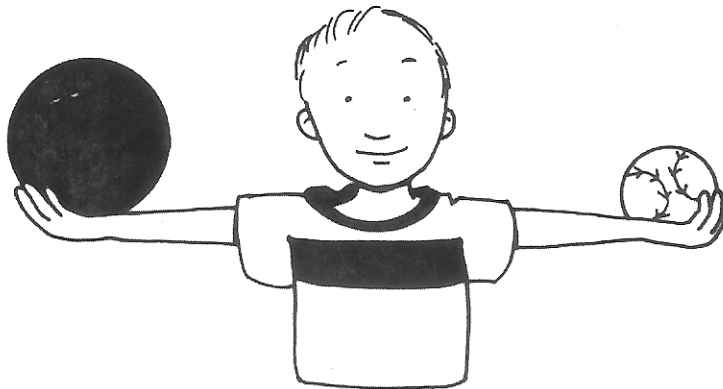
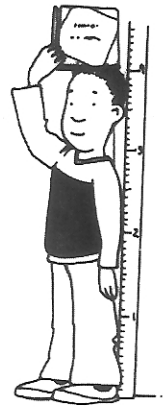
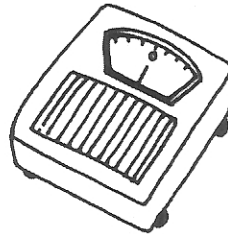
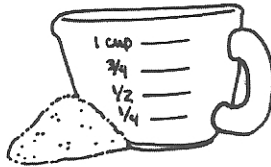
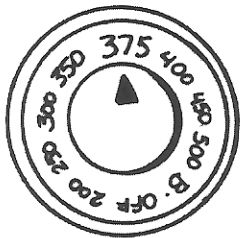




Family Note
